


Science is a powerful tool — but peace and development are the true goals. When science is guided by ethics and compassion, it becomes a force that unites people and protects the planet.








Postal Department Conducted Letter Writing Competition




The assembly concluded with a pledge to maintain unity and contribute positively to our society. It was a meaningful and enriching experience for everyone present.

The observance reinforced the school's commitment to nurturing socially responsible citizens and fostering an environment where every girl feels protected and valued.








Al and Data Science
